

Quiet Life of Jesus - Snowflakes

The "quiet life" of Jesus is that time between His birth and His 3 years of preaching and teaching. The best time to meditate on the "quiet life" of Jesus is sometime between Christmas and Lent. This wintery craft is meant to help children think about Jesus as a child – growing, discovering, working and playing! Just like they do!

You will need:

- Snowflakes - made from paper, foam, or other material (about 3 to 4 inches around is good)
- small religious images – see last page
- glue
- scissors
- glitter or glitter-glue
- hooks, tape, or string to hang the snowflakes

Instructions:

1. Have the children make paper snowflakes. Or purchase foam snowflakes from a craft store.
2. Cut out the images and glued one to the center of each snowflake.
3. Then use glitter or glitter-glue to decorate the snowflakes and around the images.
4. Once they were dry add a hook or string.
5. Hang them around the classroom, house, or hand them on a stick-tree

Our tree was created by adding a few flat, clear, marbles to the bottom of a mason jar. Then collect sticks and arranged them in the jar to form a "tree".
